
## Water Purification in the Home Using Reverse Osmosis

Have you heard about reverse osmosis (RO) water filtration in the home? Depending on the condition of one's source water and street and household water lines, the water you drink -- whether tap, carbon filtered, alkaline, or bottled -- may contain chemicals, heavy metals, nuclear material, and potential allergens. Drinking purified water minimizes one's exposure to such contaminants. There are two methods of filtration to purify water: distillation and reverse osmosis (RO). A RO unit completely filters most natural and synthetic toxins, microbes, debris, and minerals.

Join us as Mark Ruehrshneck discusses reverse osmosis filtration for whole house or kitchen sink water use. He will describe the process of RO and its effectiveness. He will detail what it takes to install, license, operate and maintain such a system and will answer questions about how RO works.
